March FoodShare Campaign

Annandale United Methodist Church is a registered participant in the March campaign again this year. Minnesota FoodShare began its work with a campaign advanced

by congregations to restock food shelves in the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Area. The effort was so successful and the need was so evident, the March Campaign became a statewide program just one year later.

The largest grassroots food and fund drive in the state, the Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign brings together community organizations, businesses, and faith communities to help stock nearly 300 food shelves statewide. In 2018, over \$8.1 million dollars and 5.5 million pounds of food were raised by Minnesota food shelves and Minnesota FoodShare.

Minnesota FoodShare envisions a Minnesota where all residents have access to healthy food and no one struggles with food insecurity. The March Campaign addresses these issues directly and you are invited to join those efforts and advocate for long-term solutions to food insecurity and poverty in our communities.

We have a special opportunity to help our local food shelf on Sunday, March 10, when our Mission March donations will be given to the food shelf. Ed and Jean Skomoroh will be with us on that date to tell the story of our local food shelf and to share the impact of your cash donations.
